

Use caution when backing down inclines

A forklift operator was backing a machine down a 21-percent slope when he tried to turn the loaded forklift. The right rear wheel started to climb a steep bank and the machine tipped over. He suffered fatal injuries when his head was crushed by the metal protective structure. He was not wearing a seat belt. A seat belt may have secured him from falling against the protective structure.

Prevention alert:

- Develop written safe work procedures for forklift operations.
- Do not turn sideways when operating a forklift on an incline.
- Wear a seat belt when a forklift is equipped with one.
