## **Biohazardous Spill Cleanup**

## Procedures

- 1. Get the Biohazard Cleanup Kit from:
- 2. Kit includes disinfectant, protective gown, gloves, absorbent paper, a biohazard waste bag, protective eyewear and a mask.
- 3. If the spill is in a common area, mark it off with a "Wet Area Sign" available in the janitorial closet, or use barrier tape.



4. Put on the gloves and protective gown. If splashing is anticipated, protective eyewear and a mask should be worn.



- 5. The area should then be decontaminated with disinfectant solution or a 1:10 solution of household bleach for ten minutes.
- 6. Remove visible material with absorbent towels.



- 7. Dispose of towels in the biohazard bag provided.
- 8. Dry the area with absorbent towels and dispose of the towels in the biohazard bag.



- 9. Dispose of gloves in the biohazard bag and wash hands well.
- 10. Dispose of protective gown in the biohazard bag.

If you think you might be exposed to blood or other potentially infectious bodily fluids, you should get the Hepatitis B vaccine series, which is available at the Norris Health Center.
